hysicians specialized in haematology and allied fields are the best qualified to treat blood cancer patients.

In the past, several successful treatment methods were used in treating children with leukaemia. But in the future, the focus will be on personalized medicine, which includes 'targeted treatment' and 'immunotherapy', Chimeric Antigen Receptor T-cell therapy and Bi-specific antibodies. These most developed immunotherapies though not available to Sri Lankan patients yet, they can be successfully treated or even cured with available treatment options. However, advanced laboratory testing is needed to sub-classify blood cancers.

Lanka Hospital Blood Cancer Centre (LHBCC) is used for treatment as well as for training.

Even in countries with best facilities, the optimal survival (OS) rate of patients with Acute Myeloid Leukaemia ranges between 25.0 % and 40.0 %. Continuous treatment in our cohort showed an estimated OS rate

of 62.9%. Compared with conventional chemotherapy and radiotherapy, immunomodulatory drugs, proteosome inhibitors and monoclonal antibodies improved survival significantly. The LHBCC showed a median OS of 84.2 months and an estimated 5 year survival rate of 65.0%. Our cohort of young adults with Hodgkin Lymphoma showed a 5 year survival rate of 81.0% and with continued treatment, survival was 90.0%.

Infection is the main cause of blood cancer mortality but have shown the successful management of neutropenic sepsis and viral infections in the resource constrained setting in a recently published study.

The data in these studies support the feasibility of establishing a successful and dedicated.

Wew Trends in Dengue Prevention and Treatment" seminar held on 25th March 2024 had a participation of over 75 professional from OPA. Dr Lucian Jayasuriya and Dr Sanath Goonasekara represented IMPA. Seminar was organized by OPA through the Health and Nutrition Committee with active contribution of IMPA

Dr Sudath Samarawera (Director / National Dengue Prevention Program) presented on "Current Global and Sri Lankan Situation in Dengue and new trends in prevention and control". "If managed properly at the right time with the right drugs Dengue is not a deadly disease was his main message. New innovative approaches which are been currently piloted in Sri Lanka was presented. Finally, he inform the audience for behavioral modification and to clean one's garden once a week.

Dr Jayantha Weeraman (IMPA member) spoke on "Dengue Infection, Pathophysiology, Treatment and Care". Dr Weeraman differentiated Dengue Fever (DF)

and Dengue Hemorrhagic Fever (DHF) illustrating the febrile phase, critical phase and convalescence phase. When a person having "high fever" for 1-7 days, and fever subsiding but patient is still feeling ill patient may be going to the critical phase. A good rest during the Febrile Phase and in the convalescence was emphasized. Importance of management with symptomatic care, correct maintenance of fluid imbalances and prevention of hemorrhage was highlighted.

Dr Sanath Hettige (Council Member of IMPA and the Chairperson of the the OPA Health and Nutrition Committee) presented on "Protect Yourself from Dengue and What is New" outlining what simple things everyone can adopt in day-to-day life to prevent getting Dengue with environmental adjustments and life style modifications.

Dr Kanthi Ariyarathne, the Convener of the Health and Nutrition Committee of OPA and one of the Joint Secretaries of IMPA was the Moderator of the seminar.

- 7. Obituary




