Malaria Death

A malaria death was reported on 15th of September from BH Panadura.

The deceased is a 47-year-old male from Wadduwa, a Merchant Seaman who returned from Guinea on the 30th of August 2024 after five months of stay there. Since 2nd September he has had fever and was treated by a GP and MP test was ordered and done at Cey Med Hospital on 9th September and MP test was negative. The patient did not respond to the treatment and was admitted to the BH Panadura on 12th September.

While in the ward the patient had developed convulsions, and a CT scan of the brain was done and found to have mild cerebral oedema. He was admitted

to the ICU and intubated. Until the 13th morning, no MP testing was done and on the 13th a MP test was ordered and found to be positive for Plasmodium falciparum. AMC was informed and within an hour IV artesunate was started. Despite three doses of IV artesunate given, the patient died on the evening of 14th September. All the necessary field surveillance is being done.

The importance of a basic test for MP for a patient with a travel history need to be reiterated. The last circular of the Ministry of health on malaria was in 2014 and no fact sheet on Malaria was found on the Epidemiology unit Website.

Assessment to Identify Capacity Gaps of NGOs Working in the HIV Sector

Introduction

A n event to disseminate the results of the assessment of capacity gaps of NGOs working in the field of HIV sector in Sri Lanka was held on 18th September 2024 at the Kingsbury Hotel, Colombo.

This event was organized by the Sustainability of HIV Services for Key Populations in South-East Asia (SKPA)-2. IMPA was invited through the Country Coordinating Mechanism, Sri Lanka. Dr Sanath Goonasekara, Vice President of the Independent Medical Practitioners Association (IMPA) participating on behalf of the IMPA and Dr Kanthi Ariyarathne Secretary IMPA participating on behalf of the CCM contributed to the proceedings.

What is SKPA 2?

Sustainability of HIV Services for Key Populations in South-East Asia (SKPA)-2 is a three-year (1 July 2022 to 30 June 2025) multi-country program funded by the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis, and Malaria. It is operated through the Family Planning Association (FPA). There was SKPA 1 conducted earlier which included Sri Lanka and the present one is the second of that nature and identified as SKPA2. The program aims to improve the sustainability of evidence-informed, prioritized HIV services for key populations in Bhutan, Mongolia, the Philippines and Sri Lanka.

What is meant by Key Populations?

Key Populations (KP) actually means the people who are most vulnerable and mostly at risk. They can be different groups for different diseases.

Examples - KP for HIV/AIDS

Men having Sex with Men - MSM
Female Sex Workers - FSW
Transgender individuals - TG
People who are engaged in the tourism industry
Outbound Migrants

Women, Youth and Children are also regarded as Key Populations as they are also at risk of getting HIV infection.

Examples-KP for TB

Patients with chronic diseases such as Diabetes Mellitus and Cancer

Individuals with HIV infection and AIDS patients

Elderly men and women

Smokers

Contacts of Tuberculosis Patients- (family members/ any other close contacts from workplaces/schools) Healthcare professionals working in wards and clinics of the hospitals

Prison inmates

Malnourished individuals

Marginalized populations

Children are also regarded as Key Populations as they are also at risk of getting TB infections.

Who has done the "Assessment to Identify Capacity Gaps of NGOs Working in the HIV Sector"


A Non-Governmental Organization named Diversity And Solidarity Trust (DAST) is the organization who had conducted this assessment among other organizations directly involved in HIV prevention to identify their capacities, strengths and weaknesses etc. in order to make recommendations for developing and strengthening them further.

The assessment has been done in nine main areas of which 8th one was the Technical Capacity for HIV Service Provision. The result of that particular category showed that 72% of the organizations (23 out of 32) have shown an excellent technical capacity for HIV service provision. However, building of capacity has been identified in 28% of the organizations participated.

What is the relevance of this to IMPA?

- 1. IMPA members are scattered in Sri Lanka as General Practitioners / Primary Care Physicians and are the first first contact with patients with most of the diseases. They have a greater responsibility in identifying the key populations, suspect about their disease status, conducting appropriate investigations and referral of the suspects to the District Chest Clinics or District STD Clinics. The follow-up, proper treatment and care are also very important activities IMPA members can provide.
- 2. The NGOs working at the grassroot level in different districts may need capacity building of

- their members and surely the IMPA members are capable of providing such technical guidance as they are very well recognized in their practice areas.
- 3. The IMPA members who are experienced in the field of public health and medical administration also can be the resource personnel in capacity building training programs or workshops in different districts.


